


This is a QQI Level 3 course.


How long will the course take?

What assessments will I have to do?



There are 3 different assessments for this course.



1. Portfolio of Work.

You keep all the work you do during the course in a folder.

It might be worksheets, photos, posters, drawings, checklists.



2. Assignment

This is a short practical activity where you need to do some research.



3. Skills Demonstration

This is where you show the skills you have learnt in different tasks or in different places.



What assessments will I have to do?

You must keep all the work you do on the course safe in one folder.



The folder should have all your assessments and must show what you have learnt on the course.



Your work will be assessed at the end of the course.

This means your folder will be checked.




What will I learn on this course?

Describe one community organisation in your local area.

Describe one voluntary organisation in your local area.



Pick one community project and make a plan to take part in this project.



Take part in a short community project.



Follow the health, safety and personal hygiene rules while you take part in this project.



What will I learn on this course?



Keep a diary that shows how you have taken part in the project.



At the end of the project:

Put together a report with information about the project.



Think about what worked well and didn't work well.



Think about how the project has been good for the community.

Think about other projects that might be good to do.
