

# **Budget 2026 Highlights**





## **How Much is Being Spent?**



In Budget 2026, the Government is spending €3.8 billion on disability supports.

This amount makes up more than half of all the money given to the **Department of Children, Disability and Equality.** 



The **Department of Children**, **Disability and Equality** (or **DCDE**for short) is part of the Government.

The DCDE looks after money and plans for things like childcare supporting families, helping disabled people, and promoting equality for everyone in Ireland.











The budget for Specialist Disability
Services will increase to €3.9
billion.

#### These services include:

- Residential Care a place to live with support.
- **Respite Care** short breaks for families and carers.
- Adult Day Services daily support and activities for people over 18 years old.





The DCDE's total budget is now over €7 billion.

This is a 15% increase compared to last year in 2025.

### What Will Budget 2026 Pay for?



Money from Budget 2026 will help fund:

- 250 new residential care places.
- 1,400 new day service places.
- 150,000 home support and personal assistance hours.
- 1,000 new staff members to support disabled people.

The Department of Education and Youth will:

- Hire 1,717 new Special Needs
   Assistants (SNAs).
- Hire 1,042 new teachers,
   including 860 new Special
   Education Teachers (SETs).
- Help fund 6,500 Assessment of Needs appointments.









The Department of Social Protection will:

- Increase Domiciliary Care
   Allowance to €380 per month.
- Increase Carer's and Disability
   Allowances by €10 per week.





The Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage will:

Provide €130 million for
 17,000 grants to make homes
 more accessible.



The Department of Health will:

- Hire more therapists in primary care and mental health services.
- Increase acccess to Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS).

#### Why is this important?





All spending follows the **National Human Rights Strategy for Disabled People 2025–2030.** 

The Strategy sets out the goals and actions the Government will take to improve disabled people's lives over the next five years.

The Strategy was co-created with disabled people and is based on the idea of "equal voices, equal actions, and equal futures."
