
Fast Friends Newsletter

It was in response to the clearly communicated need for more opportunities for people to socialise with their peers within SMH that the 'Fast Friends initiative was developed in April of 2018. While initially the focus of Fast friends was on the community within SMH, now this has branched out into intellectual disabilities communities within the greater Dublin area .

This is the 1st Fast Friends Newsletter and gives an overview of our Development over the last 2 years

Friendships and relationships are usually the things that most people will say are important to them in describing their quality of life. Many people with learning disabilities however have limited opportunities to meet and make new friends.'



Limited opportunities to connect with similar others has a number of negative outcomes for physical and mental health. So many of the people we support have a very limited pool of people they see on a regular basis and little opportunity to develop new social connections. This was the inspiration for Fast Friends

Fast Friends aims to host events where people will have the opportunity to make new friends or to re-connect with friends they no longer see regularly. At a Fast Friends event, people are seated opposite somebody new and have 3 minutes to get to know them before they move on to the next person. Over an evening, each person who attends has the opportunity to talk to 5-10 people. We aim to pair people who do not know each other.


April 2018: 1st Fast Friends Event




