

Saving energy in Coolock

MINISTER for Communications, Climate Action and the Environment, Richard Bruton, visited a local facility recently to inspect upgrades that have been made under a community energy grant scheme.

The Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland upgrades at the St Michael's House Leisure Centre in Coolock have

made the centre more energy efficient and helped to reduce its carbon footprint.

Additional funding for the upgrades was supported under the scheme by Retrofit Energy Ireland Limited (REIL) partners, who donated €20,000 towards the project.

Keith Beirne, managing director of Codex Energy, and REIL's consultant

engineers showcased the completed upgrades to Minister Bruton, representatives from the SEAI, REIL and St Michael's House.

Minister Bruton congratulated St Michael's House for championing climate action as they seek to deliver a better service.
