To apply for the SMH Scholarship applicants are required to submit the following documents;

- Completed Application Form
- CV
- Transcripts of all Degrees listed
- Letter of Support from Academic Supervisor Two
- References

For the application to be eligible for review, the applicant will need to be

- affiliated to an eligible Higher Education Institution (HEI) in the Republic of Ireland; or research-
- performing organisation and the project would be supervised by an academic supervisor within the HEI. The academic supervisor will need to be identified in advance of applying for the scholarship.




APPLICATION DEADLINE

All applications must be submitted by email to research@smh.ie by 31st May 2023.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

- The expectation is that funding will commence in September 2023 and will run for two years. However, the commencement of funding may be deferred up until and no later than January 2024.
- Students in their first year of a PhD project (i.e. registered as a PhD candidate in 2022) are encouraged to apply. In the event that a student has already commenced a project, the funding will only apply prospectively.
- The Scholarship will be awarded to an individual scholar who must be under contract with a Higher Education Institution (HEI) in the Republic of Ireland.
- The HEI will be responsible for ensuring that the Scholar has access to effective procedures for resolving problems arising from the administration or supervision of The Scholarship.
