ST.MICHAEL'S House respite centre in Donabate is celebrating receiving a new wheelchair accessible bus following a donation from the Progressive Credit Union (PCU).

The €30,000 donation facilitated the purchase of a six-seater bus which will benefit over 110 service users on an annual basis.

The new bus was presented

to staff in Donabate this week by the Progressive Credit Union.

The new accessible bus will facilitate increased community visits and provide further opportunities for service users to participate in local activities in a socially inclusive manner.
