Coming to The Wayfinding Centre

This guide is about coming to The Wayfinding Centre for training.



The Wayfinding Centre is our long name we call it TWC or the Centre because it is shorter.



We are happy you want to visit the Centre.

You can come to the Centre to learn about public transport.



You can get here by bus, we have bus stops right outside.



You can also get a train or Luas but you will need to walk for 15 minutes to get here from the station.





You can also get here in a car, taxi or minivan and you can park right outside.

What you can do at the Centre.

You can practice using different types of transport. They are real but they don't move.



A Bus

You can practice getting on and off and using a ramp on a **bus** and sit in the drivers seat.



A **DART Train** carriage

You can get on and off, open and close the doors, hear announcements and go into the **drivers cab** of the DART.



The **drivers cab** is the area where the train driver sits. You can sit here too.



A Luas carriage

You can get on and off, open and close the doors and hear announcements.




An Expressway Coach

You can practice getting on and off the **coach** and sit in the drivers seat.



A Taxi

There is a **taxi** and you can practice using a ramp to get on and off.



An Airport and a Plane

We have part of a real plane and a pretend airport terminal.

An airport terminal is the building you go into before getting on the plane and when you get off.



You can go into the plane and sit on the seats.

There is also the flight deck.



The **flight deck** is where the pilots sit. It is also called a **cockpit**. You can sit here too.
